#### Major Changes to the FAFSA As We Know It...

- FAFSA will be available starting December 31, 2023 instead of October 1. For 25-26 FAFSA will be again available Oct 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Recalculation of federal aid eligibility. Eligibility for aid is more closely associated with household information on filed taxes and using poverty guidelines by state.
- Consideration for professional judgement such as dependency status and financial changes are more comprehensively considered.
- □ The actual form itself is 'simplified' from a consumer perspective (maybe not so much for aid offices ☺!)



#### How Do We Get More Information and Stay Up To Date?

- The Department of Education is currently communicating with students who have previously filed FAFSAs that the FAFSA will be available starting December 2023 instead of October

#### IDR (Income Data Retrieval) & FAFSA Signature

FTI (Federal Tax Information) & Consent

Student/Parent elects to retrieve tax information from IRS to FAFSA

Student/Parent manually enters tax information

Student/Parent can modify tax information after FAFSA submittal

Dep not married; report income of parent student lives with 9 months of year Contributors to FAFSA consent to automatic IRS data retrieval

Manual entry of tax data results in no SAI and SFS would need to perform income validation Taxes will need to be filed before SAI is provided

Consent cannot be revoked

Dep not married; report income of parent who provides the greater portion of the student's financial; a remarried parent must include their spouse's (the student's stepparent) income.







Identify on FAFSA; no EFC is calculated until SFS resolves w/family

Changes to income and/or household size after FAFSA is filed

Dependency Override

Dependency Override needed to be 'proven' by student statement each academic year enrolled Identify on FAFSA; SAI is calculated and considered 'provisional' until SFS resolves w/family

Special Circumstance = Changes leading to SAI recalculation

- Family income, assets
- Dislocated worker
- Housing change due to homelessness

Unusual Circumstances = Changes leading to dependency status

- Human trafficking
- Refugee/asylee
- Parental abandonment/incarceration, etc.

PJ assumed each year student is enrolled at your school or previous school after initially determined if circumstances remain unchanged



## Independent Student FAFSA® Form Landing Page

This is the main FAFSA<sup>®</sup> form landing page. On this page, students are directed to "Start a New Form" or "Edit Existing Form." For the purpose of this presentation, the student is beginning a new application.

## **Independent Student Log In**

If the student selects "Start a New Form" from the FAFSA® landing page and they are not logged in to StudentAid.gov, they are taken to the "Log In" page to enter their log-in credentials. To access the FAFSA form, all students are required to have a studentaid.gov account ID [FSA ID] (account username and password). If the student doesn't have an studentaid.gov account, they can select "Create an Account."

The student is asked to enter the personal information of their spouse in order to send them an invite to their FAFSA<sup>®</sup> form.

#### **Student Spouse Email**

This is NOT a view within StudentAid.gov nor the FAFSA<sup>®</sup> form. This view demonstrates a student spouse opening the FAFSA invitation from their email. The student spouse selects "Log In" and is taken to StudentAid.gov.



## Student Spouse Log In

The student spouse is taken from their email to the "Log In" page to enter their log-in credentials. To access the FAFSA® form, all users are required to have a studentaid.gov account ID [FSA ID] (account username and password). If the student spouse doesn't have a studentaid.gov account, they can select "Create an Account."

#### Student Spouse Status Center – My Activity

After successfully logging in, the student spouse is taken to their "My Activity" page. The student spouse sees an invitation to be a contributor on the student's FAFSA<sup>®</sup> form.

Being a contributor does NOT implicate financial responsibility. However, if a required contributor refuses to provide information, it will result in an incomplete FAFSA, and the student will become ineligible for federal student aid

#### **Consent Info**

#### Important!

Consent is a new process that alerts the IRS that both the student and contributor(s) are allowing the IRS to share federal tax information with the Department of Education. Completion of the FAFSA is reliant upon consent. If consent is not given, the FAFSA form will remain incomplete, and the student will be ineligible for federal student aid.



#### **Married Student Provides Consent**

This page informs the student about consent and their federal tax information. By providing consent, the student's federal tax information is transferred directly into the FAFSA® form from the IRS to help complete the Student Financials section. The student selects "Approve" to provide consent and is taken to the next page.

#### **Married Student Section Complete**

Upon signing the student section, the student is presented the student section complete page. This page displays information for the student about next steps, including tracking their FAFSA® form. The student is reminded that their form is not completed and can't be submitted until their spouse completes the contributor section of the form and signs it. Next, in this scenario, the student's invited spouse will enter the FAFSA form and complete the spousal section.





#### **Student Spouse Provides Consent**

This page informs the student spouse about consent and their federal tax information. By providing consent, the student spouse's federal tax information is transferred directly into the FAFSA<sup>®</sup> form from the IRS to help complete the Student Spouse Financials section. The student spouse selects "Approve" to provide consent and is taken to the next page.

# **Student Spouse Confirmation**

Upon submitting the student's FAFSA® form, the student spouse is presented an abbreviated confirmation page. This page displays information about tracking the student's FAFSA form and next steps. The student will receive an email with the full, detailed confirmation. With the student and student spouse sections completed and signed, the FAFSA form is now considered complete and submitted for processing.





## Independent Student **Onboarding (4 of 4)**

The last FAFSA® onboarding page provides information about what to expect once the FAFSA form is completed and submitted. On this page, the student can select "Start the FAFSA form" to begin.

After submission, you'll need to check on the status of your FAFSA® form and make corrections, if required. Yourform will be processed in 1–3 days.  You'll receive a FAFSA Submission Summary. It will include the Student Aid Index (SAI), a number used to determine fedral student aid eligibility. # **FAFSA Submission Summary Landing Page**

The student receives a FAFSA Submission Summary for their processed FAFSA<sup>®</sup> form and any subsequent corrections that they submit. The FAFSA Submission Summary is broken into four tabs: Eligibility Overview, FAFSA Form Answers, School Information, and Next Steps. At the top, the student will see information about when their form was received and processed. They also have the option to print their FAFSA Submission Summary to keep for their records.







## **Next Steps**

On the Next Steps tab, the student sees comments that pertain to their FAFSA<sup>®</sup> form. Some comments may require the student to start a correction or send additional documentation to their school. Other comments may be informational and do not require any further action from the student.

- ✓ Winter/Spring bills will be published after spring registration with a due date of first week of January
- Missing documents will prevent financial aid from populating onto student billing statements. Financial aid missing docs will be listed on the initial offer letter.
- ✓ If students are expressing mitigating circumstances post FAFSAfiling such as parent separation/divorce, death, incarceration, job/income loss, please have them reach out with our offices asap
- Summer bills will be published after summer/fall registration with a due date of May 1<sup>st\*</sup>
- Undergraduate PA State Grant recipients will need to apply for a Summer State Grant. Applications should be available starting in April

Ongoing updates to FAFSA information and help resources will be posted to StudentAid.gov including FAFSA process implementation updates.

FSA will develop videos to engage students and families. Topics will include "Preparing for the FAFSA Form" and "2024-25 FAFSA FAQs".

The 2024-2025 will be available starting December 31, 2023. This means schools should start to send out financial aid offers starting February 2024
