- *Alvernia's Bachelor's Degree Requirements in the Course Catalog specify that 12 credits in the major and 9 credits in the minor must be completed at Alvernia University*
- *When pursuing a double major, you must have 12 distinct credits between the two majors*
- *A student who has 6 or less credits remaining to complete the degree may participate in the May Commencement Ceremony.*
- *The Graduation Application is available online in myAlvernia on the 'Academics' tab. Seniors must submit the Graduation Application to the Registrar's Office as follows: October 1 for May Graduation; December 1 for August graduation; and March 1 for December graduation.*

Major Notes

Addictions and Mental Health Treatment majors, as part of the requirements for AMH 404 and 405:

Practicum Field Experience will be required to obtain a Child Abuse clearance, a PA Criminal Record Check, and an FBI clearance including fingerprinting. Any arrest and/or conviction may or may not prohibit students from participating in Practicums Field Experience.
