Method Used to determine funding:

Students requesting Emergency Financial Aid Grants are required to complete an application to request funding to support personal expenses related to their college educational costs which may also include a prior or current account balance. The student is asked to provide a requested amount and if requesting for account balance must check a box on the application granting permission to apply the request to the balance. All applications are reviewed and evaluated based on a rubric that has been established. The rubric provided a weighted range for funding eligibility based on Estimated Family Contribution, outstanding balance, residential status, cumulative grade point average, scholarship level, academic progress, students statement and documentation of Emergency Grant Need. Award range from \$0 to \$10,000.

Students who submit an application but do not provide information of funding request, impact of the

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COVID-19 pandemic, and/or submit an incomplete application are followed up on a regular basis by the university to complete the application process so that Emergency Grant can be provided to the student as quickly as possible. Students may resubmit their application with additional/updated details, submit additional details, responses to follow-up by email and/or additional documentation to support the request.
