## TEACHER CANDIDACY

Teacher candidacy signifies the formal admission to the teacher preparation program. Students admitted to pursue an education major at Alvernia University must apply for teacher candidacy by the end of the sophomore year. Mid-degree transfer students must apply for teacher candidacy within the first semester of their studies at Alvernia University. Teacher candidacy status is required to enroll in upper division education courses, pre-student teaching, and student teaching To declare teacher candidacy, students must satisfy the following requirements:

- •Earn minimum of 48 credits including 6 math, 3 English composition, and 3 American/British literature credits with earned Grade C or better. Please refer to the program coursework requirements in the Catalog
-     - Earn a cumulative GPA 3.0 or better.
-     - Satisfy the field experience requirements.

Submit the application for the teacher candidacy to the Education Department for review and obtain approval.
