

### Community Service & Engagement

Students served approximately 8,500 hours throughout the fall semester! We look forward to continuing to serve our local and global communities throughout the spring semester.



Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service was rescheduled to multiple dates throughout January and February due to inclement weather on 1/17. Throughout this time, students will serve the needs of local organizations such as Southern Middle School, Mercy Ministries, Mary's Shelter, Hope Rescue Mission, Reading Public Works, Reading Firefighter's Museum, Cafe Esperanza, and more! The kick-off event happened the morning of Martin Luther King Jr. Day as a group of Alvernia students served alongside Mayor Eddie Moran and Senator Judy Schwank to hand out hot chocolate, snacks, scarves, and hats to City residents. ## CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Throughout December and January, the Career Development team reflected on the fall semester and brainstormed for the spring. Some highlights from the fall include presenting to 26 classes (a mix of SEARCH seminars and upper-level classes) and hosting 127 individual career coaching appointments. Resume reviews remain the most frequently requested appointment topic, with internship search strategies and general career coaching as other popular topics. In early January, the team enjoyed welcoming new student staff members. Career Development will continue to ramp up programmatic and advising offerings through partnerships with faculty and student organizations this spring.

# **Reading Youth Initiative**

Throughout the Fall 2021 semester, RYI assisted over 440 1st through 12th grade students throughout the four programs (Millmont Elementary, Tyson-Schoener Elementary, Southern Middle School and Reading High School). Our servicelearning partnerships, SPE 110 and PSY 208 students

contributed **over 600 hours of community service** to the RYI programs! 12 RCSP students made the **Dean's List** which includes every person in Cohort 8 (our freshmen cohort)! We are so proud of them!



We are also happy to welcome our newest team member, **Angie Drebushenko**, to the team as our RYI Program Coordinator.
