

## Six- Semester Plan Bachelor of Science in Nursing- Spring Start for Transfer Students

Transfer students must also ensure they take the following courses- COM (not 100 or 101), PHI 105, THE 105, THE 210 and a PHI or THE 200-400 level, Lit, History or Political Science, 2 semesters of a foreign language, Course from the Creative Arts.

C+ grade or higher must be obtained for all NUR courses

Students are required to take the TEAS exam prior to registering for NUR 209. Students who do not obtain a score of proficient must complete the Launch program prior to registering for NUR 209.
